Season Launch Highlights

Following the thrilling final concert of the Ottawa Choral Society's 2008-09 season on Sunday, May 3rd, Music Director Matthew Larkin invited patrons to a launch party to hear about the exciting 2009-10 concert season he has in store for them. Going into his fifth year with Ottawa's 110-voice symphonic chorus, Larkin prefaced his remarks by saying that he is having "an absolutely terrific time working with the choir". He recalled the choir's November performance of Thomas Tallis's magnificent aural soundscape in 40 separate parts, *Spem in alium*, saying that he is "tremendously pleased that our choristers are so secure as individual singers that I was able to programme the most daunting repertoire and achieve such a beautiful performance." Larkin told the audience "the members of the Choral Society continue to inspire me. We have an incredible diversity of singers: health professionals, lawyers, academics, clergy, scientists, engineers and financial wizards; seasoned choral musicians, and talented young people who are just discovering the great masterworks of Western choral literature, and I am proud to share the stage with them." He ended with the promise that "whether you come to be challenged or inspired, our 2009-10 subscription season will take your breath away with its musical genius, offer you food for thought, make you smile, and leave you knowing that you've had an experience of lasting significance in the concert hall."

2009-10 Subscription Series Concerts

Christmas with the Choral Society! Saturday, December 5, 2009, 8:00 pm

Larkin announced a three-concert subscription package that opens in the splendid twin-steeped Church of St. Francis of Assisi with a revival of the family-oriented audience favourite, ***Christmas with the Choral Society***. To celebrate the season, Larkin has invited Jackie Hawley and her Ottawa Children's Choir, and an exuberant brass quintet and organ, to share the stage with the OCS. The two choirs will join to braid a gorgeous garland of Christmas music ornamented with delightful motets and carols by **Gabrieli, Schutz, Sweelinck, Distler, Willan and Britten**, among others. Special highlights will be Daniel Pinkham's jubilant *Christmas Cantata* along with the exciting **world premiere** of Matthew Larkin's new music for Christmas, commissioned by the OCS for the children and adults to perform together.

St. Matthew Passion: Sunday, March 28, 2010, 2:30 pm

In the week preceding Easter, Larkin will lead the Choral Society in the ***St. Matthew Passion***, Johann Sebastian Bach's monumental choral drama. Certain to become a milestone in this generation of the Choir's history, the Passion's cast of characters calls for six leading soloists along with smaller cameo roles, a semi-chorus of boys' voices, double chorus and double orchestra. The *St. Matthew Passion* is deeply affecting liturgical theatre. Through its grave majesty and Bach's unparalleled musical imagination, the Passion story is telescoped across two thousand years of time and becomes visceral and immediate. The performance takes place in the glorious acoustic of St. Joseph's Church in Sandy Hill.

The OCS subscription series concludes in the NAC's Southam Hall on **May 17th**, in **a co-production with the Ottawa Symphony Orchestra**, with Sergei Prokofiev's epic cantata, ***Alexander Nevsky***, under the direction of David Currie. Originally conceived as the score for the 1938 film *Alexander Nevsky* by the iconic Russian director Eisenstein, Prokofiev brings to life the story of the legendary 11th century Russian knight Prince Alexander Nevsky, who sent the Barbarians packing in an epic battle on the ice of the River Neva, deep in the frozen barrens of Russia. Prokofiev later developed the film score as a cantata for the concert stage where, with its electrifying Battle on the Ice, historical romance and tragic pathos, it has found a life of its own as a thrilling piece of choral theatre.

The concert will also mark Larkin's debut appearance on the podium of the Ottawa Symphony Orchestra when he will conduct ***Three Limericks***, a ribald and cabaret-like song cycle for mezzo-soprano, choir and a chamber orchestra of brass, winds and percussion, from the inimitable voice of the late Canadian composer Harry Somers. Somers penned ***Three Limericks*** in 1990 as a centenary tribute to his great friend, the beloved composer Healey Willan, who was known to have composed more than a few choice limericks of his own!

2009-10 Season Guests

Larkin has invited a splendid roster of guest artists to appear with the OCS in the upcoming season. Himself an ardent advocate of Boys choirs, he is tremendously pleased that Jackie Hawley and her **Ottawa Children's Choir** will join the OCS for December's *Christmas with the Choral Society* concert when some of Ottawa's leading brass players also will be on hand to 'blow their trumpets' to herald the natal day.

On the roster for March's *St. Matthew Passion*, a galaxy of outstanding artists that includes the **Boys' Choir of Christ Church Cathedral**, 2009 Juno Award nominee, soprano **Shannon Mercer**, tenor **Michiel Schrey** in his signature role of the Evangelist, new-comer, counter-tenor **Daniel Cabena**, tenor, **Nils Brown**, baritone **Sean Watson** and the American bass-baritone, **Sumner Thompson** as Christ. The superb musicians of the **Ottawa Music Company Orchestra** will join the choir for this presentation.

Mezzo-soprano **Michèle Bogdanowicz** dazzled the OCS audience with her virtuoso performance in the choir's 2007 concert, *Notes from America*. In the final season concert with the OSO in May 2010, Ms. Bogdanowicz's brilliant dramatic talents will thrill audience members as she moves from tragedienne in Prokofiev's *Alexander Nevsky* to comedienne in her performance of Somers's *Three Limericks*.

A World Premiere

The choir is proud to have an inspired composer as its Music Director and for the past four seasons, has commissioned new works from Matthew Larkin. The premiere performances of his two exquisite song cycles, *Four Songs of Love and Loss* and *'wife in winter'* were triumphs that received thrilling audience reception and warm critical notice. The OCS continues the tradition in the new season with the world premiere of Larkin's new music for Christmas that will hear the beautiful voices of the children's choir in concert with the adult chorus.

During the 2009-10 season, the OCS will perform with the National Arts Centre Orchestra on three of its series concerts:

A Chorus of Hits! October 22, 23, 24, 2009- The NAC Orchestra's popular Principal Pops Conductor, Jack Everly leads the orchestra and chorus in a "Top 40" choral extravaganza that covers the entire gamut from Broadway to Cathedral to Opera Stage and the music of the cinema.

Missa Solemnis - February 10, 11, 2010 - Ludwig van Beethoven's awe-inspiring *Missa Solemnis* directed by NACO Maestro Pinchas Zukerman.

The "Symphony of a Thousand" - June 16/17, 2010 - Gustav Mahler's *Symphony No. 8 the "Symphony of a Thousand"*, in a joint performance with NACO and the Orchestre Métropolitain du Grand Montréal directed by the young Quebec superstar conductor Yannick Nézet-Séguin,
